Kinini Village's Story

Our third year purchasing coffee from the Kinini Washing Station. Kinini translates to “this big thing right here” and it certainly depicts the gravitas of what has been achieved. Formed by Jacquie Turner and Malcolm Clear, the construction of the washing station was a gamble. Malcolm leveraged his own life insurance to build the station in order to support local smallholders and children affected by the Rwandan Genocide. They also built a pharmacy, school, and local credit institution. Aiming to provide something long-term and sustainable, the washing station was built, farmers organized, coffee seedlings distributed, and the rest is history.
