Alvarez Family's Story

Don Emilio Belismelis came to El Salvador in 1863 from Cádiz, Spain. Don Emilio settled in the department of Santa Ana, and dedicated his life to growing coffee and raising his family in the country. Today, coffee operations are currently managed by the fifth (Raul Alvarez Belismelis) and sixth (Sebastian Alvarez Borgonovo) generation from the Alvarez family. The family group has 15 farms in all the coffee-growing regions of El Salvador, totaling 880 hectares, the majority being in the western part of the country.
